# The Day The Crayons Quit Literacy Activities Who am I? Oral Guessing Game 

## Read or ask an adult to read aloud for you! Can you guess which crayon is speaking?

"I feel so empty Duncan. You can't see me if I didn't have a black outline. Who am I?"
"I am glad I've been your favourite colour for such a long time, but there isn't much of me left. Give me a break. Who am I?"

"Duncan, I love my workload.
You use me to colour dinosaurs, trees and frogs. Who am I?"
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"Duncan, I need your help! I'm naked and can't leave the crayon box. Who am I?"
"I am not speaking to Yellow Crayon. Can you tell him I am the real colour of the sun? Who am I?"
"You use me all year round and to colour fruits. Who am I?"

Choose 1 or 2 of the activities below and complete in your exercise book.

| Draw and label each of the 12 crayons who wrote letters to Duncan. | Draw and label the 4 BIG animals that Duncan uses the Grey Crayon for. | Draw the 2 crayons that have fallen out with each other. Write a sentence explaining why they are no longer friends. |
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| Write 'WOW' words to describe the picture Duncan created at the end of the story. | What is your favourite colour? <br> Write a list of things you can draw with this colour. | Write a short letter to a crayon of your choice asking for it not to quit and give reasons why you need it. |
| Draw some of the crayons and add speech bubbles to show what each crayon said. | Colourful Conversation <br> Pick 2 crayons. Based on their letters in the story what might they say to each other. Write a short conversation between them. | What happened next? <br> One day, Red Crayon woke up and climbed out of the crayon box. "I'm not coming back!" he whispered... |
