Duncan has 10 crayons in his box. Draw and write how many are **orange**?



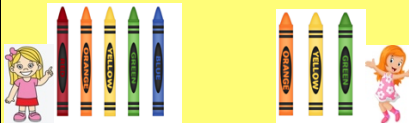
Duncan had 6 crayons in his box. He broke 2 how many are left?

Jim counted his crayons in 2s.  
The number he counted is 4 less than 24 and it is an even number. How many crayons does Jim have?
